The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation was established in 2021.

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, held annually on September 30th, is a day for Canadians to reflect on the tragic legacy of residential schools and their impact on Indigenous communities. It's a time to honor survivors, their families, and those who didn't return home, and to advance the ongoing process of reconciliation.

The day is also known as Orange Shirt Day, encouraging Canadians to wear orange to show solidarity with residential school survivors.

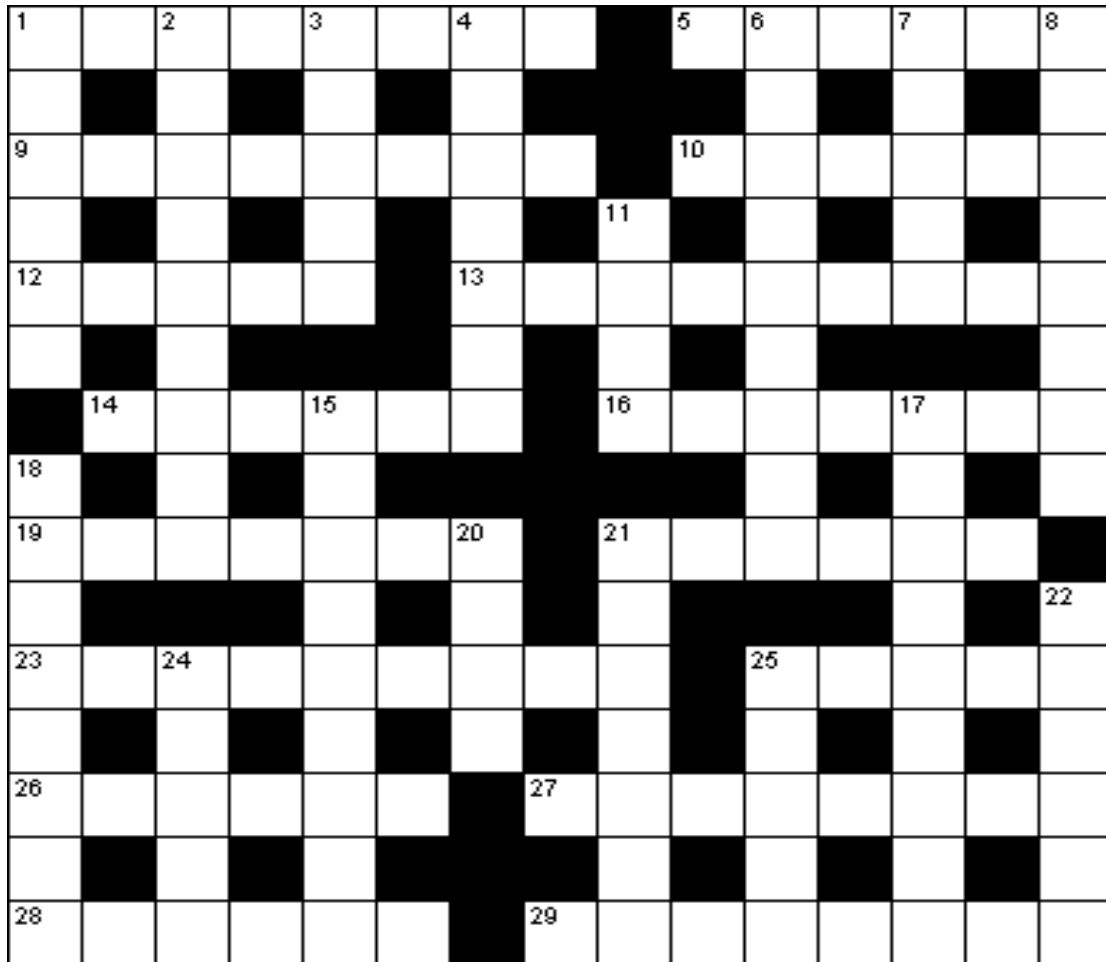

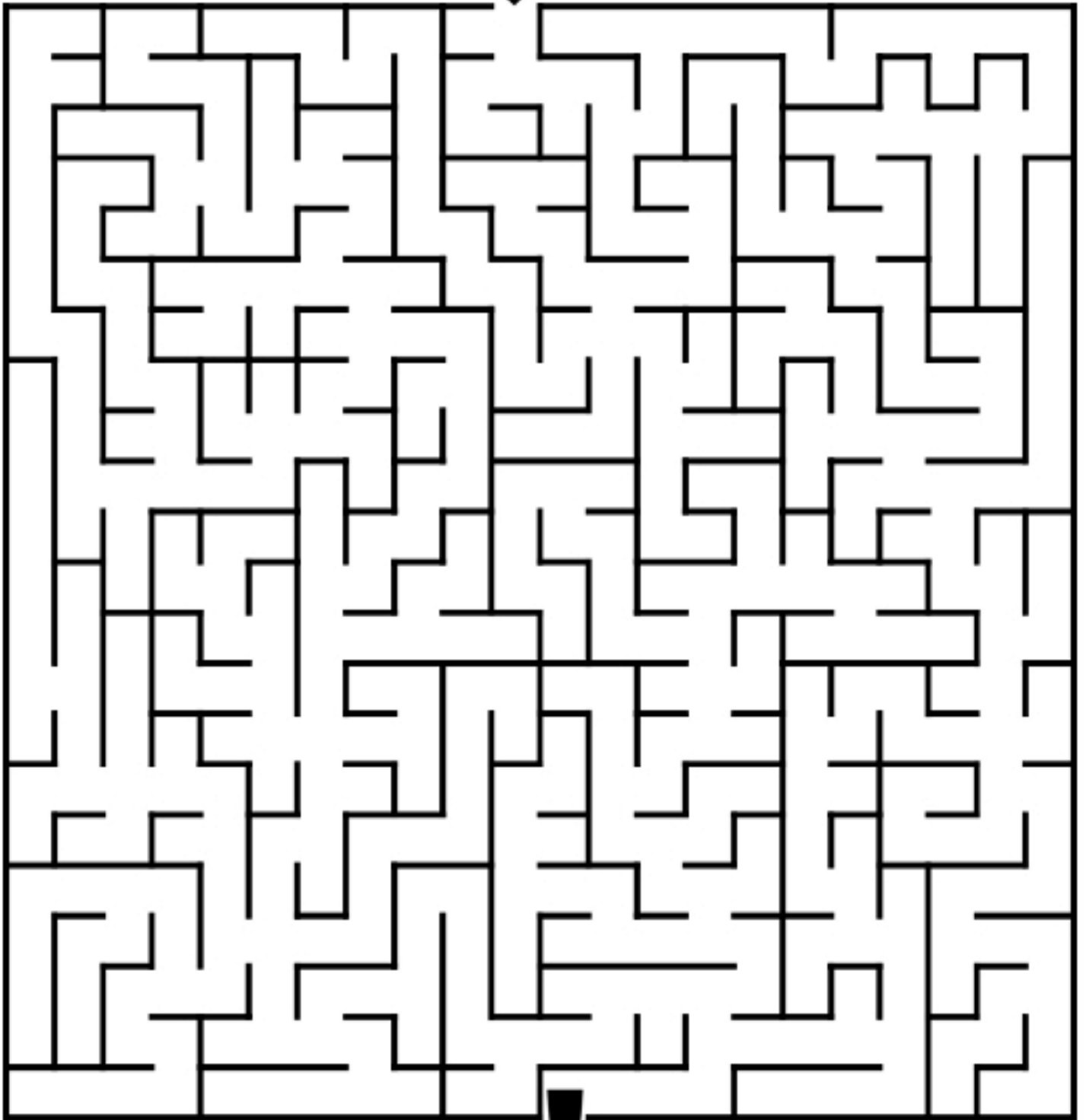
